Thinking about where we should serve is no easy task because we are all so different. Those of us who are older are tempted to

will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? You follow me!" (John 21:18-22)

I think that is what Jesus still says today. When we spend our time thinking what the other person should do, I believe that Jesus still says to us, "What is that to you? You follow me!"

If you are hearing the voice of Jesus calling you to serve through teaching, I pray that you will listen and respond with joy.

But you still have to work out just how to do it. That is what takes prayer and careful thinking.

If you are a recent college graduate, you may have the freedom to consider spending a year or two teaching in a mission school overseas. Or if you are retired and have an income, you can also consider spending a year or two teaching. If you are just out of school you may have to look for an opportunity that will pay your transportation, provide a place to live, and give you a salary. Such opportunities exist. If you have a retirement income you have more flexibility to volunteer.

Those thinking about teaching for a year or two will look for a very structured opportunity in a school sponsored by a well-known denominational agency. Others will be comfortable going to a smaller, independent school. Some will want to serve in a big city. Others will prefer a rural setting.

Another very important consideration is the kind of school to choose. Some teachers will be comfortable only in a school that is very conservative theologically, asks commitment to their theological position, and expects agreement to clearly stated standards of behavior. Other teachers feel more comfortable in Christian schools that are more accepting of diversity. Some teachers will feel comfortable teaching in schools or universities sponsored by non-Christian agencies. Each kind of school will provide many opportunities.

Everyone will have to plan wisely for travel, insurance, and medical coverage.

As I have grown older, I have found myself aware of so many opportunities and so many challenges that I find myself saying as I take on a task to which I've felt led, "Well, I'll do what I can!" That frees me up. I don't have to be like Peter, comparing myself to someone else who could do it better. I just do what I can and thank the Lord for giving me the opportunity to serve him.

Dr. Randy Gardner, State Director for South Carolina, was elected Historian. He will make annual contributions to our historical files at the library at Samford University.

News from Books on Mission

You are bringing such fine materials, our struggle is always how to best get them to those who need them.

The least costly way to ship heavy things like books is to fill a whole shipping container and send it to someone in a country whom we can trust to get it through customs, unpack it, and deliver boxes to seminaries, Bible schools, and local pastors in their country. That is what we are doing as we fill a container to be sent to the Nagaland area of India where a people movement some years ago meant that many people were won to the Lord, many churches were started, and a seminary and Bible school were begun to educate leaders. *See the article about having 500 of 851 boxes needed.*

Another way we have sent books is what Dr. Les Hill, our FBE Assistant Executive Director, did when he selected volumes especially useful to seminaries in the Philippines where he served for so many years, and shipped boxes for which Book-Link International, Inc. provided shipping costs.

Recently, we expanded our ways of getting materials to the right place by inviting missionaries who are currently on leave to come to the NC Baptist Men's Missions Camp in Shelby and select books and materials that that would be useful when they return to the mission field.

Stephanie and Gert-Jan Vroege with Global Outreach Missions have been on leave in the Shelby area since the beginning of the year and will return to Uganda later this Fall. Stephanie is originally from Cherryville, NC, so the Vroege's have been visiting her family during this time. They have attended First Baptist Church, Shelby on several occasions, and the Sunday School Class that Ted Alexander, NC Resource Director for Books on Mission, co-teaches. The Vroege's struck up a conversation with Ted about the need for good Christian materials that they can use in their ministry work on the Islands of Uganda.

There are about 52 islands along the Buvuma Island Chain of Lake Victoria. Many of the islands are underserved and lack basic water and sanitation. They have limited or no medical access, and most have not been evangelized and/or had true Biblical teaching and discipleship.

When they return, Gert-Jan, a native of Holland, will focus on Bible study/teaching, evangelism and true Biblical



discipleship, and Stephanie, a Nurse Practitioner by trade, will help provide limited medical access in order to share the Gospel. She will also be homeschooling their two boys, Nathaniah and Josiah.



As a result of their conversation, Ted invited the Vroege's to come to the warehouse at the North Carolina Baptist Missions Men's camp and sift

through books and materials to find materials that would be appropriate and that they could take back with them on the plane flight.

After over an hour of carefully selecting materials suitable for their work, the entire Vroege family, including Nathaniah and Josiah, loaded the trunk of their car with enough books to fill three suitcases for checked luggage. An anonymous donor agreed to pay for the extra airline baggage fees.

"Our main goal at Books on Mission is to get these types of quality materials into the hands of pastors, missionaries and seminaries overseas so that the saving grace of Jesus Christ can be proclaimed," says Ted Alexander. "The way these materials get there is not as important as the fact that they get there. By allowing missionaries who may be in the area to come and select specific items they need expands our ability to target micro-groups in a way that we could not do before. If a Christian group can find a way to get the books there and pay for the cost, we are happy to supply the materials."

After the car was loaded down, the Vroege family, Ted Alexander and volunteer Bronelle Skaggs prayed over the books that God would ultimately place them into just the right hands.

Five Hundred Boxes Completed Toward 851 Goal



Books on Mission has now received enough fine resources to be able to pack 500 of the 851 boxes needed to fill the container to ship to India. At this moment Bronelle Skaggs and his team

members have caught up and are waiting for more contributions. Do you have Bibles and study books they can send? Or can you help provide money to ship the container?

We are grateful for the wonderful resources members and others have been bringing.

Remember that we are especially interested in having the kinds of things that are found in a pastor's library—Bibles, commentaries, Bible dictionaries, Bible atlases, and books on subjects such as doctrine, Biblical archaeology, church administration and leadership, how to teach the Bible, etc. Highly specialized materials such

as those about Hebrew, Greek, or Aramaic are directed toward seminaries and graduate schools. Simpler materials such as the old church study course books on particular books of the Bible are helpful are made available for use by pastors and church leaders.

Remember that we do not ship Sunday school materials because they don't communicate well to other cultures and because loads of free materials put the local publishing houses in other countries out of business

and cultivate a sense of dependence. The large teaching pictures illustrating Biblical scenes are the exception because they communicate well across cultures.

If you have Bibles and Christian study books to share, please bring them to the NCBM Missions Camp in Shelby, NC at 1327 S. Lafayette Street to be sorted, repackaged in waterproof boxes, and loaded on to the big container for shipment.
