
## Dr. Bill Greenwood, Jr., a

member who lives in Winston-Salem, N.C., is a veteran of two-dozen short-term overseas mission trips.

However, on a missionary journey to **Uganda** he saw a hunger for learning he had never witnessed before.

Uganda in East Africa lies on the equator, bordered by Sudan to the north, Kenya on the east, Congo on the west and Rwanda and Tanzania in the south and southeast.

"This war-torn nation has some 35 million inhabitants with 50 percent of them under the age of 15. The average family has some six children, often with an additional orphan child or two in the home," Greenwood said. "I went to Uganda to teach 50-60 pastors the Old Testament book of Exodus two



hours each day at the Uganda Baptist Seminary, the largest Baptist seminary in Africa," the traveling pastor explained. The seminary has over 500 pastor-students enrolled from Uganda and six surrounding nations.

"Seldom have I seen such hunger for learning. They are reluctant to leave

the classroom after the lecture/ discussion is over. Most have great difficulty paying the tuition fees of

> about \$30 per person per term which covers also all room, board and travel to the seminary," Greenwood said. God's people in the U.S.A. cover 90 percent of the cost of their education, he added.

The last two of his three weeks in Uganda Greenwood focused on guest lectures in the capitol of Kampala.

"In the mysterious providence of God, a Muslim lady served as our driver and arranger of these many details. I


can only say that God used this lady, 'Hoda,' to open many doors for us in a number of middle and high schools, as well as in two of the largest universities in the country," he said.

Greenwood said he had "carte blanche" to teach God's Word in the many schools. Most are private

> schools, which provide the bulk of the education in Uganda.

As Greenwood spoke in the crowded classrooms, students sat often four to a primitive desk built for two. They unfailingly showed deep respect for all teachers and school staff. Their school buildings were in severe disrepair, with little or no light in the classrooms and tin roofs that leaked when it rained.

"Nevertheless, their hunger for learning was like pouring water on a dry sponge," Greenwood said.

While in Kampala, the retired North Carolina pastor asked the Baptist Seminary to lend him a student helper.

"They awarded me their best faculty lecturer,
Herbert Kabuluku, a seasoned professional who knew the city well and aided me, as did Hoda, our Muslim driver/arranger.
"Herbert shared the speaking duties with me and I learned much from this godly man,"
Greenwood said.

When asked what God had taught him during his three weeks in Uganda, Greenwood replied, "How do I describe or explain all that God seemed to teach me in these three short weeks in Uganda? The overriding lesson seems to be that out of their privation, their material want and their desperate struggle for life, the hunger for meaning and purpose, for the things of God, all somehow heighten their openness to the message of Christ, the sure hope of life more abundant. That hunger seems also to stand in sharp contrast with the Western world's dullness to radical Christian commitment, perhaps brought on by our affluence and material prosperity.

"I found their keen interest in the things of God, in the Bible, in the message of Christ to be exceedingly refreshing and a cause for genuine celebration," Greenwood added.

"I kept thinking that if more of our people here in the home base would step out of their bubble, out of their comfort zones and make themselves available to the clear call of God to go into all the world and proclaim the Good News, then there might be more hope for a vibrant body of Christ here in the homeland," he concluded.



Some time later Bill Greenwood also taught in the Baptist Bible School of **Belize**, saying he felt that his students often taught their teachers!

"Our team of teachers from North Carolina came to train a dozen Belize pastors and lay folk in the basics of the Christian life, but the tables soon turned."

Greenwood taught the first half of the Old Testament survey while his pastor, Rev. Todd Haley of Oaklawn Baptist Church taught the class in preaching. The third instructor, Dr. Mark Nickens, taught the New Testament survey course. Students come for a week three times a year, then return home for guided studies between sessions.

Belize is a small Central American country of some 314,000 people just south of Mexico on the Caribbean coast. Formerly known as British Honduras, Belize is the only English speaking country in Central America.

Greenwood said, "It always amazes me to meet and interact with committed Christians in other parts of the world. These Belize believers are no different. Facing a very weak economy with unemployment running

over 30%, these students take valuable time away from home and work and come eager to learn more of the Christian life and how to reach their villages. We go to help them, but they bless us with the depth of their discipleship."

## Thomas D. Brown,


another member from North Carolina can't travel to distant places to teach because he is a prisoner. Before going to prison, he

was a lawyer. Now he has rededicated his life to the Lord and expresses his faith by tutoring other prisoners.

His Sunday school teacher, Gerald Cook, says of him, "I have come to know Tom Brown very well the last four years, and he has served as an inspiration for his ability to stand firm in difficult circumstances. The Lord has really directed his time in prison to refocus his priorities and to serve Him in a steadfast manner. There is no doubt that God has plans for his service when he is released. Tom has helped many prisoners by helping them with their GED and teaching Sunday school."

Erle Dixon, a young man Mr. Brown has been tutoring says, "I can say that now I am a better person than I was five or ten years ago, because now I am more focused on getting my G.E.D. I can also say that I have a very good teacher, Tom Brown."


"He has made a big difference in my life in helping me get my G.E.D. and walking the path with God."... "Once I have [the G.E.D.] I can move on in life and be the husband that my wife always wanted."

A friend of Tom's, Burt Shuford, says, "Tom's letters to me have been full of God's love, hope for the future and humor. In the stories of prison life that he has related to me he has told of the respect and honor that he has earned in the prison population, all clearly arising out of the light of the Lord shinning through him in such a dark place. Tom has clearly used his abilities and his love of the Lord to encourage the other inmates in countless ways, including the pursuit of their GED degrees, and has made his "mission field" a much better place. While I cannot speak from direct personal experience regarding his teaching activities with his fellow inmates, I can surely say that if he has been as encouraging to the inmates as he has been to me through his letters, that he has been extraordinarily effective and impactful."

**Sarah Snell**, a new member, joined so she could receive up-to-date lists of volunteer opportunities. She has already had twenty-five years of ministry in South Korea, Indonesia, Guam, and China and is an active volunteer in her church and in
