My Honduras Experience

I had been visiting the Good Shepherd Children's Home outside of Tegucigalpa, Honduras with mission teams for eight or nine years, but this time as I approached I realized that I would not be there for just an hour or two visiting the children. This time I would be at the Home for over five months, serving as an English teacher at the Good Shepherd Christian Academy.

As I climbed up the mountain to Casa Verde each day for my noon and evening meals, I often had to pause to catch my breath. But it

gave me a chance to survey the peaceful beauty that God has created—mountains encircling green forest growth watered almost daily with an evening shower, a heavier night rain, and an occasional all-out downpour in the daytime. What a beautiful setting for serving our Creator and Lord.

I have told friends and acquaintances that this was the hardest job I ever had in my life—and I have over 46 years experience teaching children and adults of all ages. The schedule itself was demanding: teaching English to often-reluctant students in grades two through nine from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. two days a week. In addition, I spent time creating new learning materials, tutoring children who needed extra help in English or other studies, reading to preschool children, and opening the reading room in Casita 7 for any who cared to read for pleasure. But the payoffs were great—

seeing a reluctant student shyly smiling over getting a right answer, hearing three and four year olds clamoring for me to read another book, seeing a second or third grader reading to a non-reader, knowing that I was right where God wanted me at this particular time of my life.

Was my time at Good Shepherd Children's Home physically and emotionally demanding for a 78-year-old retired teacher? Absolutely! Would I do it again? I



have, in fact, returned as a tutor for a shorter period, and I will soon return again as a tutor and general helper.

If you would like to know more, go to the Baptist Medical and Dental Missions International (BMDMI) website and look for the Good Shepherd Children's Home (GSCH); or go directly to the children's home, but be sure to put in "Honduras," as there is at least one other GSCH. The last time I looked, the website had good pictures of the children at the first day of school.

The school goes from pre-K to 9th; I taught English to the 2nd through 9th grades. Most of the children are residents of the Home, but a few students from the area pay tuition to attend. The teachers are mostly Hondurans, though some of the BMDMI missionaries sometimes teach. Lissette Carpenter, McGregor, TX lfc7@att.net

Theological Education Books Sent

This September 17th another box of approximately 125 books was delivered to the shipper for the Southern Philippine Baptist Theological Seminary. (SPBTS) The seminary is located in Davao City on the southern island of Mindanao.

Dr. Jim Castlin, former music missionary to the Philippines, contributed a large number of his books. Many of the books provided means for learning and research in music and worship. Other books spoke to other theological education needs. Dr. Castlin presently is Director of Missions for the Hazzard Baptist Association in Kentucky.

Olin Williams, Director of Book-Link International, Inc., assisted in the effort, contributing some of the books from the Eubank, Kentucky warehouse. He also provided Book-Link funds to pay shipment costs.

The shipper estimates that the seminary will receive the books sometime in November. This is the second box of books that FBE and Book-Link have sent to SPBTS.

Les Hill, Kentucky State Director for the Fellowship of Baptist Educators, says, "It has been gratifying to provide this assistance for SPBTS. My wife and I began our second missionary term in the Philippines joining the faculty of the Mindanao Baptist Bible School that became SPBTS."

"In retirement, we volunteered to serve with the Mission Service Corps then run by the North American Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. We also served as recruiters for teachers for international mission schools related to The Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). We had some wonderful experiences! One of the best came in when we learned of a need for an experienced Christian educator in Trinidad and Tobago.



"Pastor Wayne Rowbottom of San Fernando Baptist Church in Trinidad had requested the International Mission Board to enlist an educator to come and speak to secondary students about how to handle the temptations of Carnival, a season of celebrations comparable to Mardi Gras. An indication of the seriousness of the situation was that 90 per cent of children born out of wedlock were born nine months after the Carnival celebration. Someone suggested that a key part of the message that the young people needed to hear was "No wed. No bed." One of his church members, Ruby Thompson, would coordinate the schedule and activities.

"Ruby, a graduate of Stanford University, was an extremely capable, vibrant, effective and well-respected person. I asked her why she just didn't go to the schools and speak. She said that she, a local person, wouldn't be accepted for that role, but a white foreigner would be so honored. So I was given a rare opportunity. We visited eleven secondary schools and

four churches. Sue and I also led a family wellness program in the church focusing on the relationship among the family, the school and the church.

"Forty-five people attended the Seminar. Sue worked with children and I with adults.

"We were hosted by John and Evelyn Pruitt, missionaries supported by the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. The picture shows the four of us.

"John served as Pastor of Rich Plain Baptist Church, and Evelyn served as pianist.

"Sue is pictured with a group of children.



"This building was built by Southern Baptist volunteers.

"In one of the schools I had planned to speak about Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego from Daniel, chapter 3. My outline was: They wouldn't bow, so you should be faithful. They wouldn't budge, so you should be Firm. They wouldn't burn, so you should be fearless.

"I thought that the story would relate well to the temptations the students might face in Carnival. Remember: "No wed. No bed!"

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Remembering A Mission Trip to Trinidad and Tobago

A joyful experience illustrates how God can use volunteers

Joseph W. House says, "Sue and I retired from our work at Milpitas Christian Schools in Milpitas, California, where I had served as Superintendent and Sue had directed the Special Needs Assistance Program.

"Our wonderful coordinator cautioned me: many of the students were worshippers of idols in their Eastern religions and might be offended. She advised me to use that plan with just the Christian group that was allowed to meet during released time, and I agreed. First, the Hindu group heard about a visiting speaker and asked to attend, then a Buddhist group, and then several others. Finally, it turned out that the entire student body wanted to come, so Ruby said, "Well, they asked to come. Let 'em have it!"

"The entire student body assembled to hear the message



"At another school, Ruby took us to a rally of Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship celebrating forty years of serving Christ in Trinidad and Tobago.

"There are about 1.3 million people in Trinidad and Tobago with roots in Africa, India, Europe, The Middle East, and China. The largest part of the population of Tobago is of African descent. What a mission field! Let's pray for the Christians living and serving there, and let's pray that Southern Baptist missionaries and volunteers will continue to support the work there."

"Serving in China helped me appreciate what I have, and reaffirmed it's not the material things that are important in life," Bethany said after she served this last summer in rural China as an English teacher and then as a computer technician for a church camp in Beijing.

Bobbie was touched by the sincerity of Chinese Christians even after teaching there for 5 summers. "When I see and hear

these Chinese Christians pray it breaks my heart. They pray from the very depth of their soul, so sincere and deep."

Bobbie and Bethany are mother and daughter. who now have a special bond. Now they know Chinese people by name for whom they can pray. They know the joys of using their English skills to make a difference in the lives of rural teachers and students. They remember the young women who said "I was unsure of my faith/beliefs until camp last year."

Carson Newman University student Kristyn, and Texans Bobbie and Bethany shared teaching techniques with students in Qin Xian, Shanxi, China.

Opportunities for Teachers Overseas Through CBF

Many opportunities are available through CBF. The following are examples.

English Teacher Northern Thailand (Musikee)

This assignment is in a very rural boarding school in a Karen village. The school has about 700 students, ranging from age 5 to 18, covering all grade levels. The ideal candidate will hold a Bachelors' Degree, be a native English speaker and have prior teaching experience (TESL experience would be helpful). A single or couple can be considered for this assignment. Length: Minimum of 20 week school term (May – October or November – March)

English Teacher Bangkok area of Thailand (Nang Mon, Chonburi Province)
This assignment is for an English teacher to work with 4th to 12th grade students. The school, located in Bangkok, is a boarding school of primarily Thai and Chinese students. Being a boarding school, teachers are required to become part of the community. Most of the teachers live on campus in school housing and form a nice Christian community to be a part of. A Bachelors' Degree is required and teaching experience, particularly with children of varied nationalities, is a plus. A single or a couple can be considered for this assignment. Length: Minimum of an academic year (May – March)

China ESL Teachers-Working through the Chinese

government to place ESL teachers in impoverished areas of the country These are paid positions through the TIP program. More information is on the CBF web site.

Chongqing, China English Teacher in School for the Blind,
An individual is needed to teach English in the Chongqing School for the Blind. In

addition to teaching visually impaired students, the individual will provide training and/or conversation practice for teaching staff (sighted). Teaching

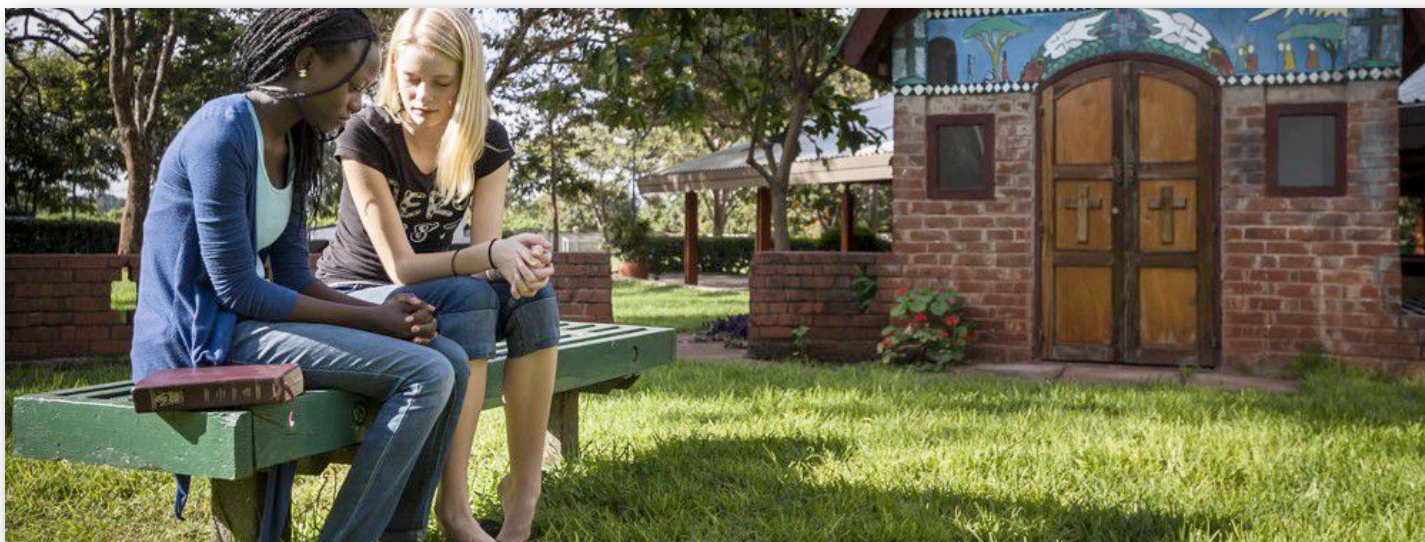
