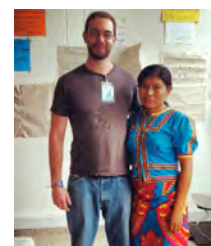
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Remembering

Dr. John Carter 1921-2014

Dr. John Carter, age 92, of Birmingham, AL, went home to be with the Lord on March 2, 2014. John served as the Executive Director of the Fellowship of Baptist Educators from 1988 until 2005 when he was named Executive Director Emeritus.

In the 1980's, the Brotherhood Commission, SBC, organized a number of vocational Fellowships, one of them for Educators. The medical and dental Fellowships were already in existence, and they and the Educators are the only ones still functioning. The survival of the Educators group is due to the hard work and support

of John, his wife Fran, and several other early leaders.

As a World War II Army paratrooper, John landed in the Southern France invasion and participated in the Battle of the Bulge. As a long-time member of Dawson Memorial Baptist Church, John directed the Conversational English ESL program for many years and taught Sunday School until age 91. He also wrote books and denominational curriculum for the Southern Baptist Convention for more than twenty-five years. He was the retired Dean of



the School of Education at Samford University, where he taught for 30 years.

John and Fran led more than 15 short-term mission trips to China, Honduras, Russia, Indonesia, and Mexico. He and Fran also had two semester-long professorships at Anhui Normal University in Wuhu, China and Hong Kong Baptist University. More recently, John and Fran have presented more than 250 programs as Rosie the Riveter and her World War II Paratrooper to numerous local organizations in 17 states.

The FBE extends love and sympathy to Fran, John's wife of 68 years, their son, LtCol. Wayne Carter, USMC, Ret [Regina], their daughter Nell Branum [Jim], their seven grandchildren, eight great-grandchildren, and brother, Dr. Henry Carter [Mary].

Update on Books Sent to Karen Schools

FBE has been working with American Baptists to send books to seminaries and Bible schools for Karen refugees in Thailand. This is an update on the project.



Our contact, Duane Binkley, reported, "The container of books arrived in Bangkok around December 25th and after customs, holidays and such, arrived in Chiang Mai in good shape on January 8th.

The lane the Bible School in Chiang Mai is on is too small for the truck to deliver the container, so a smaller truck had to be arranged to shuttle the books to the school. Some of the students provided the labor to load and unload the books." "The Bible School in Chiang Mai is dividing the books and arranging to send them to three additional Bible Schools. One load of books has already gone to the Bible school at the Mae La Camp. Others will follow."

When the books arrived it was still dry in Thailand for another month or two, so the books should get to all the camps before the rains make transport more difficult.

Duane also reported, "The International Book Project had two more pallets of books earmarked for Burma, but communications broke down. So those two pallets are also being sent to Thailand to add to the container that we sent. That is an extra bonus we hadn't planned on.

"Thanks again for your efforts to make the shipment possible," he concluded.

The world literally has come to our doorstep on several occasions in the guise of international students who have stayed with us for short visits during holidays, summers, etc. Our children grew up knowing people from several different cultures and countries around the globe who added to their desire to travel as they grew into youth and young adulthood!

Last year my husband and I had the opportunity of hosting an international student from Slovakia who had gotten involved in our church and actually was brought to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ through a Sunday School teacher! Where she lived with another family during the first semester of school was really not a good fit for her or for the host family. When I heard at church that she would have to return home if they could not find another family, my husband and I

looked at each other and said, "Why not?" Why not, indeed! How could we pass up the opportunity to disciple this new believer in Christ, in our home, before she returned to her native country of Slovakia, where she knew no other Christians!

On January 1, Zuzka moved in with us and quickly began to share our home, our hearts, our extended family, our spiritual heritage, and our faith! The very first afternoon, she came downstairs with her Bible and her journal and asked if I would answer questions that she had written down from reading the first two chapters of the book of John! This quickly became almost a daily ritual as she soaked up God's word and stretched her mind around the new truths she encountered. She looked forward to "picking my brain" as she put it, about cultural issues, spiritual beliefs, and family matters. She became very involved in our church youth group and even though there was the normal girl "drama," she fit in fairly well and loved being a part of activities that she knew nothing of in her culture. We SKYPED often with her parents and her older brother who was a college student at Cambridge University in England. We shopped for prom dresses together, bought her first boutonniere for her date, attended her "ring ceremony" at our local high school, and experienced her baptism in our church after she received permission from her parents. At the end of her semester, her father flew from Slovakia to America and stayed with us for a few days as she said goodbye to her American friends and church family. He barely spoke English, but we enjoyed getting to know him and introducing him to American foods and fun places! He was interested in knowing more about our church and enjoyed meeting church friends who had been special friends to his daughter! They then spent two weeks touring the West before heading back to Slovakia.

The experience of "adopting" this precious young woman into our hearts and our family has changed us forever! We SKYPE often and chat on Facebook almost daily! Before she left our country, I was able to locate an IMB missionary who lived just blocks from her in Bratislava, Slovakia, and who now meets her on a regular basis to continue to disciple her! We plan to visit

her in her country at some point in the future!

What an humbling experience it has been to pour our hearts and souls into the life of this young woman who is hungry for spiritual truths and who will one day, no doubt, be a spiritual leader in her country! We are blessed! --

Using English to reach an unreached people group

Our church of about 45 members was invited by God to join Him in what He was doing in Colombia. He led us to the far northwestern part of Colombia to a rural area where there are numerous groups of indigenous peoples unreached for Christ.

The Colombian government has mandated

that every person graduating from high school and university have a high level of English competency. However, resources to make that happen in the rural and indigenous areas are few.

We joined with two Colombian Baptist churches to provide English development classes to about sixty English teachers, many who had never spoken English with a North American. Most could read and write English, but had a difficult time speaking and comprehending native speakers. Four of the teachers in the group

did not know any English yet. We sent teams of six individuals to work with Colombian translators to conduct four weeklong classes in English and teach methods our Colombian teachers can use to enhance their teaching.

The local Secretary of Education has become very excited by the results he has seen and the teachers look forward to our return. We will graduate our first class in April and are looking forward to starting another year long course in June. The relationships we have developed have given us the opportunity to share Christ and His love. Now we have been invited to work in another local school system composed entirely of indigenous teachers and students.

It is amazing to see God at work. Several other small churches like ours are joining us to do this work. God has provided the workers and the money to make the project possible. Already we can see God changing lives and hearts. Two indigenous individuals have accepted Christ through the work of local believers because of doors opened by our obedience to God's invitation. As one indigenous lady asked, "Why did it take you so long to come and tell us about Jesus?" How do you answer a question like that other than to pray for God's mercy and grace to lead us to continue to be faithful to do the work He has given us to do.

Volunteers for China

Volunteers for China is seeking volunteers willing to serve in China beginning in July 2014. Volunteers will reflect Christ while using English in conversational English classes.
