Are Volunteers Safe?

Should the threat of terrorism or disease keep us from volunteering to teach in mission schools?

In August the Liberian President Johnson Sirleaf ordered that all schools be closed because of the Ebola outbreak. His order included the Baptist-affiliated Liberia Baptist Theological Seminary, Rick's Institute, and the Lott Carey Mission School. Our members have taught in each of them. Is it safe for anyone to be overseas to teach now?



Is it safe to fly when terrorists are intent on doing the United States harm?

I am convinced that the safest place for any of us to be is in the center of God's will for our lives. I don't believe God asks us to take unnecessary risks, and I don't believe he promises to deliver us when we do. Jesus refused the temptation to jump from a high point in the Temple so God could spectacularly save him making his connection with the Father easy to believe. Instead he said we should not tempt God. Rather than doing the spectacular or becoming a military leader, he became a teacher who won disciples and patiently taught them.

I do think that Jesus wants us to be courageous in serving him and spreading his word. One of my favorite scriptures is John 10:27-30 that records how Jesus assured his disciples that they had eternal life and would never perish.

As his disciples serving wherever he leads, I believe we are safe in his hand and in the hand of the Father.

New Location for Shipping Bibles and Study Books

New Location for shipping books, continued

For several years we have brought books to the Shelby Missions Camp to process, but then shipped them to the Book-Link warehouse in Kentucky where they were packed into containers for shipment. Now we are working with North Carolina Baptist Men to receive, process, pack, and send materials directly from Shelby.

If you are in North or South Carolina you will find the Shelby location to be convenient and close to I 85.

We invite you to bring your Bibles and Christian study books to the NCBM Missions Camp in Shelby at 1327 S. Lafayette Street where they will be sorted, repackaged in water proof boxes, and loaded on to the big container for shipment. David or Janet Brown are the volunteers who run the camp, so please call them at 919-422-9990 or 919-337-2342 to schedule a time to come.

If you live in Eastern North Carolina you can leave books at the Red Springs Mission Camp, Red Springs, N.C. 28377 where Larry Osborne is the Camp Coordinator. His number is 919-264-4397.

It costs forty cents a pound to ship materials in the big containers, so please help cover the cost. Some of the retired pastors and missionaries who generously contribute their libraries are not able to cover this cost, so contributions from others are needed.

Shelby, NC 28152. We will send you a receipt. The Fellowship of Baptist Educators is recognized as a 501-C-3 charity for tax purposes.



We are especially interested in having the kinds of things that are found in a pastor's library—Bibles, commentaries, Bible dictionaries, Bible atlases, and books on subjects such as

doctrine, Biblical archaeology, church administration and leadership, how to teach the Bible, etc. The old church study course books on particular books of the Bible are helpful. We would rather not ship Sunday school materials because they don't communicate well to other cultures and because loads of free materials put the local publishing houses out of business and cultivate a sense of dependence. The large teaching pictures illustrating Biblical scenes are the exception because they communicate well across cultures.

People ask why pastors and church leaders in other countries don't just get on the Internet to find all the resources they need. There are several reasons. First of all, they can't afford it. Some don't even have it available in their areas. And those who can get on line have a hard time identifying the reliable sources. Pastors and other church leaders who have families to support, have full time jobs, and serve their churches on the side have neither the time or the money to walk into the village and pay for access to a computer at an internet café when they are preparing sermons or need to find answers to church related questions.

A Testimony from Joanne Dale

2002 was a decisive year for me. My husband died in November of 2001. I was a healthy 70-year old with a love for people. A former pastor said I was an "Andrew," because of the way I witnessed indirectly. So that spring I called the International Mission Board to ask if there were any English teaching positions open in Asia. They suggested I call Edge Institute. This led to three trips to China to teach conversational English and American Culture to High School students on their summer break. The kids were so full of life. We did all kinds of things with them. We had a wedding, a Christmas Pageant, birthday parties, taught them

American sports and games, and introduced foods to them. I remember one night in "English Corner" trying to explain a 25 pound Thanksgiving turkey to them. All they could compare it to was a chicken!

The year of the SARS epidemic I didn't go to Asia. I found an Illinois group going through a Bulgaria partnership to a church in Sophia. This was short trip, and we taught 8 to 70-year olds in our classes. One family was immigrating to the U.S. soon after this, so it was a way for them to at least get a feel for English.

In 2007 a missionary from India asked me to go to Bangalore and teach in a small



Christian school for missionary kids and Indian Christian worker's children. I taught 5th and 6th grade for a semester, then taught music the next year in the same school. What a rewarding

time! The kids were great and the parents were terrific!



I went with two other music teachers to Liberia to teach music at Ricks Institute one year. I taught the high schoolers to read music and taught the younger two to play bells. They

learned enough in those two weeks to play for the annual Liberian Women's Conference. We were so proud of them!

For two years I went to Bangkok to help test homeschooled children of missionaries to see if they were up to American standards. After testing in the morning, we did all kinds of fun things with the children in the afternoons and evenings. I graded the tests and had parent conferences.

The last two years I went to Chiang Mai, Thailand to work with missionary kids while their parents attended IMB conferences.

Last summer I worked with Anita Charles in Haiti. I hope some of you who are reading this article will join her next summer. (See article on p. 5)

Sometimes it was hard to decide if God was really calling me to some of these places. Sometimes they just seemed to fall into place, so I knew He was behind it. It does take commitment. The very first time I went, my documents didn't come until all the other teachers had left for China. I traveled to San Francisco to meet the group and they were all gone! I had no money for a ticket home, so I just went ahead. When I got to Hong Kong there was no one to meet me. But I knew God would provide, and He did.

Volunteering is the most rewarding thing anyone can do. I wonder what I would have done with myself these last years if I hadn't. Volunteering gives us a chance to give back to our churches and to God for all they have done for us. And volunteering helps us fulfill the marching orders Jesus gave us in the great commission.

Food is provided by the YMCA. Cost approximately \$1300 plus round trip air ticket to China.

Attendance at the local Chinese Christian church will provide you with a first hand experience of the growth of the church in China. In all projects, making friends is an open door to sharing your faith. We are careful to obey all laws of China and share our faith within those guidelines.

Other Opportunities

Teach in **Kampar, Malaysia**. Committed, believing teachers are needed for an opportunity in **Kampar, Malaysia**. Teachers can go for either three months or one year. Anyone may come under the three-month program, but those who come for the one-year program need to have had some experience, especially with ESL.

Volunteers in the three-month program get a little over \$300 per month and a place to stay. Those in the one-year program get a little less than \$1000 per month, their accommodations, half of their airfare, and other benefits. Two-year positions are also available with even more benefits. K-12 teachers must, at minimum, have a bachelor's degree and some teaching experience in a classroom. Some institutions may have additional requirements depending on the level of educational programming or the need for certain specialties. For ESL teachers, a TEFL Certification is desired and CBE TEFL Professional Certification is recognized.

Higher education teachers and faculty must have a Master's degree at a minimum and some teaching experience in a classroom. In many nations, a Ph.D., EDD, or terminal degree in the designated field is required. Additional skills needed would be specified in the request.

The Consortium for Global Education also offers opportunities such as a Semester of study at LCC International University in Klaipeda, Lithuania, Internships and study opportunities at CAPA's Dublin and London Centers, and Communication opportunities and semester study at private Korean universities.
