Books on Mission 205 and counting

Books on Mission is working to fill its first container of books to be shipped from the Shelby Missions Camp. The enormous container will hold 881 boxes of books. So far we have packed 150 and have 55 waiting to be processed.

We are grateful for the wonderful resources members and others are bringing.

We are especially interested in having the kinds of things that are found in a pastor's library—Bibles, commentaries, Bible dictionaries, Bible atlases, and books on subjects such as doctrine, Biblical archaeology, church administration and leadership, how to teach the Bible, etc. The old church study course books on particular books of the Bible are helpful.

We do not ship Sunday school materials because they don't communicate well to other cultures and because loads of free materials put the local publishing houses out of business and cultivate a sense of dependence. The large teaching pictures illustrating Biblical scenes are the exception because they communicate well across cultures.

If you have Bibles and Christian study books to share, please bring them to the NCBM Missions Camp in Shelby, NC at 1327 S. Lafayette Street to be sorted, repackaged in waterproof boxes, and loaded on to the big container for shipment. Missions or Ministry?

When I studied missions in seminary, my professor was always careful to point out that missions and ministry are two different things. Missions is crossing some kind of barrier to share the good news about how God sent Jesus to save us from our sins and give us new life. Ministry is doing something in the name of Jesus to help someone. Both are necessary. Both are commanded in the New Testament. But one can't take the place of the other. We are not fulfilling the Great Commission if, while we are doing ministry, we fail to share Christ with those who need to know him.

There is a place in Shelby, North Carolina just seven miles down the road from where I live where people come from all over the country to do both missions and ministry. (cont.)

Missions or Ministry (cont.)

It is called the North Carolina Baptist Men Missions Camp. When there is a tornado, a flood, or some other kind of disaster in our area, Christian people from all over the country come and stay there so they can go out and minister in the name of Jesus.

Volunteers also come to do local construction work such as constructing a men’s shelter, building ramps, and repairing houses.



As they work, those volunteers often cross cultural, racial, and economic barriers to help people recover from disasters. But they don’t stop with ministry; they also share the good news about Jesus, and that is missions. Those who have been blessed by their ministries but don’t know Jesus are ready to listen. The volunteers are doing both ministry and missions.

Some of the volunteers at the Shelby Missions Center stay in the warehouse to do their work. As they carefully pack Bibles and Christian study materials they are doing missions by sending Christian study materials to schools overseas that prepare preachers and missionaries in their home countries. Their work crosses geographic barriers to help prepare those who will communicate the good news in their own languages to their own people.

Is our heavenly Father calling you to serve him in ministry and missions through the Shelby Missions Camp?

Teaching Cross-Culturally

One of our members, Mike Smith, President of Jacksonville College in Texas, sent these suggestions.

Teaching cross-culturally is an education in itself, especially when a translator is involved. I have learned many valuable lessons from experience as I have had the privilege of traveling to forty-six countries.

A qualified interpreter will save you a lot of embarrassment. In giving instructions for all adults to rise and go to their assigned classroom, the translator who was inexperienced and not proficient said, "Will all adulterers rise and go to your classroom." Needless to say I was confused why no one was rising.

A shorter sermon/lesson is essential to stay on schedule since everything you say is repeated.

A manuscript will aid you and your interpreter. Even if you do not preach/teach with notes in your usual forum, a written manuscript is essential cross-

culturally so the translator can know in advance what you plan to say.

An awareness of that culture's beliefs is helpful in preparation. When I taught in an Eastern Europe Seminary the president instructed me to give a final. Part of the course was the use of various evangelism methods, one being the Evangel Cube. During the final I noticed everyone taking the final but one. I asked the interpreter to approach the student and see if there was a problem. The interpreter informed me the student did not believe in "icons" and to him the Evangel Cube was iconoclastic. Had I known this beforehand I could have made other arrangements.

Teaching cross-culturally is a very rewarding experience. The students hunger to learn, and their appreciation leaves a lasting impression on the teacher who will look forward to the next opportunity.

Memories That Don't Fade

Delores Cork from Georgia shared this warm memory. – Editor

Throughout the 1980's, under the leadership of the "world's best encourager," Bob Franklin, the Montgomery Baptist Association and the Department of Human Resources partnered to offer what we called the New Life School. We taught ESL to over 100 Southeast Asian refugees while many churches served as their sponsors. I taught the most advanced class of Laotians, Eu Mien, and Vietnamese.

One day when a young Vietnamese man named Thanh came to class with his eyes looking distinctly orange I quickly gave the class an assignment so I could ask him privately if he would allow me to take him to a doctor. He refused.

Later, during the break, his friends told me in their limited English that he was trying to commit "ethical suicide." He had been writing his mother back home and including money to help her. When she had not responded, Thanh decided that she was being persecuted because of his escape to the States so he stopped eating. The students explained that once a person has experienced malaria, if they do not keep up good nutrition, the malaria will return and show itself in their eyes.

I returned to the classroom to sit down beside Thanh and insist that he not assume anything drastic about his mother when he really did not know for sure. I stressed that he had to maintain his health so he could help us work through the Red Cross to find out more details about his mother. Only he could give us names and addresses that might help us to find her.

Then I said, "While we search for her, we must also help you through your depression in three ways: writing, art, and music." I grabbed a clean sheet of white poster board and a handful of magic markers and asked him to draw out his feelings. Then I asked him to write as best he could an account of his escape from the Communist invasion of Vietnam. As we talked, one of his friends came back into the classroom and offered to lend him a guitar for as long as he needed it. Thanh chuckled and said, "O.K., I will try to do what you say."

The next Monday, he brought back a beautiful drawing on the poster board. In the upper right corner, there was a woman praying for people around the world who were depicted below in the lower part of the poster in different kinds of clothes representing various ethnicities from all over the world. Some of the figures were beating or robbing others; some were kicking fallen women, (continued on next page)

and others were attacking and killing other men, women, and children. I was so impressed that I had his wonderful picture framed.

Months later, Thanh brought a large manuscript that we ultimately had printed as a full book. And his neighbors assured me that he played the guitar at all hours of the night. With the help of God, he worked through that terrible time of depression while we searched for his mother.

The Red Cross found his mother at the address that Thanh had given us. It seems that a local postal worker had been opening his letters to remove the cash and then throwing the letters and envelopes into a sack under the counter. Thanh's mother eventually got all of his letters and a few years later got to move to the United States where she became the babysitter for his children.

Thanh grew up as a Buddhist, and his mother insists that he remain a Buddhist in order to be able to pray her into the Buddhist "hereafter." As an obedient son, he thinks he must comply for her lifetime. No matter how long it takes, despite his intense Buddhist background, please continue to pray with me that the Holy Spirit will lead Thanh to accept Jesus as the only "way, the truth, and the life."

Dr. Paul Reitzer from Alabama, past president of FBE, has been appointed to serve another term on the Baptist World Alliance Commission on Baptist Heritage and Identity. Paul has been active in serving the BWA for many years.

Dr. Gayle Avant from Texas, a State Director, is serving on the BWA Commission on Social Concerns.

The Baptist World Alliance, now composed of 232 conventions and unions from 121 countries and territories, representing 40 million members of 177,000 churches is meeting July 22 - 26 in Durban, South Africa. Several of our members who live in South Africa will also be participating.

Jackie and Novella McClung recently brought about 600 pounds of books from the Salt Lake City area to the Shelby Missions Camp. Jackie and Novella, retired missionaries with the North American Mission Board (SBC), had been asked to come back to Salt Lake to help revitalize the ministries they had been involved in when they served there. This time they served in a church, a food/clothes pantry, the Associational office, and the missionary in residence house.

Several pastors and churches had donated books to the Associational office. Dan Walker, the Associational Missionary, said he needed the space and needed to do something with the books. "When we saw what they

were," Novella wrote, "we immediately thought of the Fellowship of Baptist Educators."

Ted Alexander, North Carolina Resource Director for Books on Mission, recently went to the Providence Baptist Church in Charlotte to pick up a second load of the Bibles and study materials that had been contributed as a part of the "Book and a Buck" emphasis of the NC Cooperative Baptist Fellowship annual spring meeting.

He loaded his convertible full to the brim and then travelled on to Winston-Salem to attend the gathering of the North Carolina Baptist Men for their meeting at Calvary Baptist Church.

That evening, as Ted was driving home on the expressway, all the traffic came to a stop because of an accident. The wait was so long that everyone turned off their motors, got out of their vehicles, and began to walk about and talk with each other.

A Hispanic man told Ted that he was very unhappy with the wait because he was missing a movie date with his estranged wife. He had hoped that the date might get them back together. As they talked, Ted felt led to witness to him, so right there beside the highway he told the man about how to confess his sins and come to know Jesus as personal Savior. When the man agreed and prayed with him, Ted wished he had a Bible to give to the man as he began his Christian life. Then Ted remembered that his car was loaded with study materials. He opened the back of the car and found a new NIV study Bible, still in its original box, right on top.

Ted gave it to the man suggesting that when he got home he should begin his new life by reading the book of John in the New Testament.

Later when Ted unloaded the books at the Shelby Missions Camp he was amazed to find that there was not another new Bible in any of the boxes.

Les Hill shipped approximately two hundred and fifty books to the Philippines. Both the Philippine Baptist Theological Seminary, Baguio City (PBTS) and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, (SPBTS) Davao City received a box. The books included some given previously by Dr. Brenda Hazell, our FBE State Director in Florida. Also, Dr. Jim Castlen provided some. He is a retired associational missionary and formerly music professor both at Clear Creek Baptist College, Kentucky and PBTS in Baguio City. Dr. Wallace, retired ethics professor from Samford University, Alabama contributed a significant number of books and helped to cover the shipping costs. Les Hill, FBE president, added to the books numbers as well. Olin Williams through Book-Link provided the balance of the shipping costs.



The books had been carefully selected to assist toward theological education. SPBTS is beginning to upgrade its studies to include an M.Div. and the books will be helpful to make that possible.

Phil and Wilda Perrin are teaching at Guangya School in Dujaingyan, China which is in the Sichuan Province near the large city of Chengdu. Phil writes, "This is a private school for kindergarten through high school. I am starting a choral program of a high school choir, a volunteer choir of mostly teachers, and an auditioned vocal training group of 50 children. Wilda is accompanying and assisting me with the two choirs. We were home for the February month-long celebration of the Chinese New Year and returned to China in March to teach the second semester."

"The picture that has the inflatable labeled 'love' is from a holiday," Phil continued. "The picture of us and our neighbors relaxing on the top of our building overlooks fields of Rape seeds from which Canola oil will be made."



Lorena Mayhugh wrote, "I have been in Bangkok, Thailand thirteen years as of August 27. I teach EFL (English as a Foreign Language) at the Baptist Student Center and tell Bible stories."

She also wrote that she will be 94 May 1st.
