A Memorable Student Needs Our Help

Vincent Chirwa is a student we'll never forget. In 1998, my wife and I had just arrived in Cape Town to teach for a semester at the Cape Town Baptist Seminary. As a part of a cooperative relationship between the North Carolina Baptist State Convention and the Baptists of South Africa, the Principal of the seminary and I had arranged an exchange. We were living in his house, driving his car, and teaching his classes. He and his family were living in a missionary residence I had arranged, driving our van, and teaching my classes at Gardner-Webb University.

At the seminary we were not the only people who had traveled a great distance. Students came from all over Africa to study. Vincent Chirwa, had come 1900 miles from his home in Blantyre, Malawi, and arrived the same semester we did. Last summer (2015) when the Baptist World Alliance met in South Africa, Dr. Gordon Miller represented us. Vincent came by,

and asked for membership, and renewed our acquaintance. He has given me permission to share his story.

When we first met him, we learned that Vincent had come to school, and was looking forward to having his wife with him as soon as their third child arrived. This is his story in his own words, edited for brevity.

"I got married in 1990 to Rosemary, and The Lord blessed us with twins, Wanangwa a boy and Tawonga a girl. Rosemary worked for World Vision International. It was while I was in Southern Bottlers when I felt the call of God to serve Him. Blantyre Baptist Church issued a call to me in 1995 to serve as an Associate Pastor.

After serving for two years I felt I needed to go to seminary in order to be better prepared for the ministry. The Cape Town Seminary accepted my application, and I enrolled for a Bachelor of Arts in Theology and a Licentiate in Theology in January of 1998. I left Blantyre for Cape Town, South Africa at a time Rosemary was expecting, and we had planned that she would join me after giving birth in a few months.

Rosemary gave birth to our third child, a girl. Unfortunately, she was poorly managed, suffered a massive stroke, went into a coma and died on 4 May 1998."

The students at the seminary took an offering to help Vincent get back home.

"I was at a loss at what to do next. I had the difficult choice of staying at home in Malawi for the rest of the year or going back to college. I wanted to go back to college, but the challenge was how I was to manage without the children. I did not like the idea of leaving the children for four years. And who was going to raise them if I left them? But if I took the children with me, how was I going to manage my college demands with them? Seminary was tough enough without them. And what about the baby? I shared with the church about my plan of going back and it did not go well with them. They felt it was going to be too much, and I would not succeed. A friend of mine and his wife, Wesley and Merle Wildschut from South Africa who were working in Blantyre offered to keep my baby. I was fully persuaded that I should continue seminary, and I went back to Cape Town.

"My life completely changed. I had to wake up early, bathe the children, feed them and take them to school. Fortunately it was near. I had to fetch them and fix them lunch and keep them occupied while I got busy with my

assignments. It was really tough to combine dad and mum roles. I am thankful to my mother who taught me to cook, wash and iron clothes. I remember days when the children got sick and I would wake at 2am in the morning to wash their soiled bed sheets. These skills helped me to survive.

"I struggled with Greek as a subject and almost gave up. My late Greek lecturer, Dr. Joe Barrow, encouraged me not to quit. By the end of the school year I got 72

percent for Greek and I did well in most of the subjects too. By God's grace I graduated with distinction for my Licentiate and also got my Bachelor of Arts in Theology in 2001. I am thankful for the love and support I received from fellow students and lecturers. Upon completion some people thought I should look for a ministry to serve in a better economy like South Africa. I was, however, determined

to come back and serve my people who did not have a pastor.

"I returned to Blantyre Baptist Church to continue ministry. I have continued serving at Blantyre Baptist Church till now. God has blessed the church and we have many ministries. The biggest ministry is the school ministry. The school started in 1996 with 6 pupils and a Head teacher but has grown over the years to over 900 pupils. The primary is arguably one of the best schools in the country. We use

the curriculum that is proscribed, but infuse it with a biblical worldview. The children are well disciplined and the results are amazing."

In 2008 Vincent married Ellen after 10 years of widowhood. Ellen is a nurse/midwife by profession who earned her PhD in nursing at University of Chicago, Illinois. She

is now a professor of nursing and is Vice Principal at Kamuzu College of Nursing, one of the constituent colleges of the University of Malawi. Vincent says she is doing well as a pastor's wife and that he is thankful to God for bringing her into his life.

His son is finishing a bachelor's degree at the United States International University in Kenya, and his last-born is in year 4 for her School Leaving Certificate in their church school. Towonga, his twin daughter, has had some struggles in life that cause her parents concern.

Vincent asks our help with the secondary school. He writes: "The secondary is quite different [from the primary school]. The teachers have no passion for imparting knowledge to the students. They use every excuse for lack of delivery. They do not enforce discipline in the students. There are, in fact, some bad models there. As a church we are not happy with the situation. We want to turn things around. With teachers who can be models and are passionate, things can change for the better. I believe that [your] partnering with us will bring the necessary changes we need. More importantly, the witness of the gospel will be strong, and the influence to touch young lives is immeasurable."
