Ann and David Wilson lead Volunteers for China.

An open letter written on the 90th Anniversary of Si Cheng Christian Church, Hangzhou, China.

It is with great joy and thanksgiving to God that we, Ann and David Wilson, celebrate with you the 90th anniversary of Hangzhou's Si Cheng Church! "The Lord your God has blessed you in all the work of your hands. He has watched over your journey through this vast wilderness." Deuteronomy 2:7 (NIV)

What a glory to God the Si Cheng Church has been during its 100 plus year history, 90 of those years at its present location. You have been a beacon of light shining Jesus' love on Jiefang Road. You have given many cups of water to the thirsty who pass by. You have preached God's word boldly and sung His praises so that those who came near could hear!

And what a blessing it has been to Ann who first worshipped there 25 years ago in 1991! As we are in Hangzhou for several days to several weeks

each year, when we arrive we feel like we've "come home." Si Cheng has become our "home" church.

Ann's story: "I had first traveled to China in 1988 and visited many historical Christian sites throughout China. On that trip I was introduced to Amity Foundation, Nanjing, and the work it did in improving the English level of Chinese teachers.

Through this introduction I later became a summer volunteer English teacher. I had no idea what a blessing that would be!

July 7, 1991, was when I was first introduced to the Si Cheng Church. At that time I was part of a team of American Christian teachers assigned by

Amity Foundation to teach English for 6 weeks at the Zheijiang Tourism School in San Bao. (That school has gone on to become the Zheijiang Tourism College in Xiao Shan.) On the first Sunday the school arranged for us to attend church. Rev. Peter Wen Hao Tsai preached that Sunday. Though I could not understand the Chinese sermon, I could

tell that he was sharing the Word of God. His face reflected peace and those people around me were listening intently.

Yet, it was the music which filled me. Pastor Tsai's wife, Eleanor Yang Lu Fu played the small foot-pumped organ and led the sanctuary choir in an anthem that touched my soul. I knew that hymn; "What a Friend We Have in Jesus"; I sang that at church in America. Then another familiar hymn. Then another. Those hymns were meant for me that Sunday! I could sing in English while everyone else sang in Chinese. What a feeling of joy I had!

After the service, as we were leaving to return to school, Pastor Tsai and Eleanor came to speak to us ... in English, good English! What a surprise! They invited us for tea in the visitor's meeting room. I and others on the team had lots of questions to ask about them and the church, but first we had a cup of Long Jing tea. So special! "Tell us your story, please." "How did you learn English so well?" "Tell us the history of this church." And so on, the questions were asked and graciously answered. Answered always in a way as to be positive about what God was doing in and through the Chinese

church. How it was growing now, never looking back to any dark spots in history.

A question came to my mind, a question which I felt I knew the answer to based on reading I

had done prior to that summer teaching assignment. Yet, a question that I wanted the pastor to answer. "What is the greatest concern for the Christian church in China today?" Pastor Tsai took a few moments then said, "It is the Mormons.

They are coming to China in large numbers."; then he paused, and looking straight at me, said "When are the Christians going to come?"

That was not the answer I expected at all! Yet, his words "when are the Christians going to come?" weighed heavy on my heart. Tears came to my eyes. That was a moment when I truly felt that God was speaking to me. God was saying

that you're a Christian and you can be helpful in China. You can teach English. You can show your Christian values as you teach. Do this and bring others.

Because of that experience, now with my husband David, we both bring Christian volunteers to teach all over China from north to south and east to west, but always in Hangzhou, somewhere. We started Volunteers for China for this purpose.

"Si Cheng Church, thank you for helping to shape our lives. We choose to no longer occupy the seats of honor on the front rows of the sanctuary when we attend worship. In our hearts we are not guests; we are part of the Si Cheng family.

Thank you to old church friends Rev. Deng Fu Cun, late Rev. Sun Xi Pei and late Teacher Yang Lu Fu who, for many summers, taught us so much about the Chinese church, who introduced us to the YMCA, and who took us to lunch

many, many times! Thank you to Pastor Zhang and Teacher Yan for your leadership in both the church and the seminary. We have seen your efforts! Thank you to the ushers and translators who welcome us and make our worship experiences richer. Thank you to all those congregants who treat us as friends, not as strangers.

Si Cheng Church has yielded many good fruits for the Kingdom of God over the last 90 years. Those are the outcome of diligent work, dedication and vision. You are committed believers in Jesus Christ. These are things we have

seen over the last 25 years. Thank you for all that you do and will continue to do in the coming years.

Our wish is that you may be empowered by the Holy Spirit and blessed as you enter a new decade of boldly sharing the gospel of Christ. Our further wish is that you will continue to be a blessing to the people of Hangzhou and China through your loving and caring ministries.

The Books on Mission North Carolina-Tuscany-Nigeria Connection

The Fellowship of Baptist Educator's Books on Mission program continues to bless people across the globe through its collection and distribution of Christian books, Bibles and study materials.

Ted Alexander, a volunteer for this program, travelled to Italy with his family in the summer of 2016 for a vacation they had dreamed of for years.

During a few days of their trip, his family stayed with friends of their Shelby NC neighbors who happened to be missionaries in Grosseto Italy-Frank and Jennie Marietta, and their three children Frankie, Arianna, and Katiana. The Maietta's are Independent Baptist missionaries and church planters sent through Baptist World Mission. They work with Nigerian refugees, seeking to identify and supply their immediate physical needs as well as introducing them to their real and immediate need of Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

The Maietta's also pastor a church in a western Tuscan town with very little evangelical presence. Enjoying the hilly Tuscan landscape, the Alexanders witnessed first hand the fruits of the Maietta's labor, driving to a small mountain town's swimming pool to

witness the baptism of three recently converted Nigerian women.

These joyful faces left a lasting impression on the Alexanders. It also left them asking the Maietta's "how can we help you"?

As a result, this summer Ted will travel back to Grosseto to assist the Maietta's. His luggage will be filled to capacity with KJV Bibles supplied from Books on Mission which had been collected at the North Carolina Baptist Men's Camp in Shelby, NC.



"When I asked Frank what he needed that I could bring with me, he did not hesitate to say 'Bibles'. Most Nigerians speak English so it was no problem for Ted to sort through the boxes of books at the missions camp where he easily found enough to fill an entire checked suitcase as well as

some in the carry-on. 'I took many Bibles home with me and used a postage scale so I could maximize the number of Bibles by their individual weight,' Ted stated.

Pray that these Bibles will get into the right hands and be a blessing to all who receive them. Pray for the Maiettas as they seek to spread the Gospel of Christ in a part of the world that is often religiously ambivalent when it comes to evangelical Christianity.

2017 has been a year of reflection for the Fellowship of Baptist Educators. At our annual meeting in July, we spent time answering three questions: Where have we been? Where are we now? And, where are we going? The FBE has a marvelous history being with its first annual meeting held in 1988 and then, because of restructuring in the Baptist Brotherhood Commission, becoming a stand-alone entity in 1996 with close ties to the International Mission Board.

Throughout the past 30 years, we have endeavored to partner with educational needs around the globe. Living and Teaching in Guatemala

"Wow! I've lived and worked in Quetzaltenango (Xela) for just over three months now."

Tammy King teaches at IAS - the Inter-American School in Quetzaltenango, the second largest city of Guatemala. Many (especially the indigenous population) continue to call the city "Xelajú" (pronounced shay-lah-WHO) or more commonly "Xela" for short, and proudly consider it the "capital of the Mayas".

Quetzaltenango is in a mountainous area. Nearly 8000 feet in elevation, it's roots are

"The majority of the students and families (85%) that we serve at IAS are Catholic (Latin American Catholic). When I discuss salvation with my students, most will say you get to heaven through following the Ten Commandments, doing good work, being good, etc. I continue to tell them salvation is through Jesus Christ...We cannot earn salvation! I also share Bible verses with them. Salvation is a gift from God...that believing that Jesus came and died for us...He took the place for our sins...he arose



"I fell the weekend of Oct. 15th and a lady in administration at school went with me to the private hospital here in Xela. I fractured my left foot (X-rays revealed a clean break on the side of my foot) - had surgery Monday, Oct. 17th and doctor put in a screw."

"I was reminded by an administrator from school-you are not home and cannot be with your family but we are your family here so you need to let us know what you need etc - we are here for you! Someone from admin was there to translate, complete forms and Be There With Me! -when I laughed and cried- when in the operating room and all were speaking Spanish and I couldn't understand - yes, tears rolled down - then I closed my eyes and just prayed and had to focus on God! Trust God! He will never leave you or forsake you and I rested in this- one of the nurses noticed my tears and wiped them and I looked up and he just squeezed my hand and smiled and I smiled and nodded and closed my eyes again- no language barrier just caring and God providing - I felt peace- God's perfect peace! the

October also brought the unexpected-a fall and a fractured foot.

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doctors, nurses, hospital staff were wonderful- and now my "family" here to lean on and to heal and recover."



"Monday night after surgery- one of the nurses brought me some lime ice cream - and the blanket is colors of MS State- I just smiled and giggled when saw that!

In March of 2017, Tammy shared,

"I went to one of my student's first communion Feb. 11th. Another one of my students and her mom came and picked me up and I rode with them. The service was held at a small church and the reception was held at a popular social event club. The setting was gorgeous. We were served a meal under a huge tent. The table decorations are popular here, too. Wow! What an

event and a special day. I sure enjoyed being a part of this special time and also visiting more with one of my families."

June brought the end of school,

"Wow! I have lived here for ten months now. We have finished a school year...well graduation is this evening, but the school year is over. Wednesday was the last day of school for the students. Did they go out with a bang: fireworks, a mariachi band and a hotdog cart with orange soda. All staff are to walk in cap and gowns and sit with the graduates at graduation ceremony to show unified support."

An earthquake registering 6.9 on the Richter Scale made for an unsettling night across all of Guatemala:

"It was strong and scary. It wasn't just swaying, but also bouncing, bumping, rocking, etc. I could hear my pots and pans bouncing around, etc. When I

realized what was happening, I got out of bed (a window is above my bed and got to the foot and got down). My emotions hit as soon as it was over. My heart was beating SO fast."

"Things were knocked over and on the floor, but only a few people had things that were broken. No damage to our places. One staff member did have some plaster from interior walls on their floors."

Tammy is affiliated with World Outreach Ministries (worldoutreach.org). Language studies have taken up her summer:

"I am thankful for being able to attend Spanish School. I took for 20 hours per week/4 hours daily. I was able to pay for this with contributions to my missionary account with World Outreach Ministries. God led me to the right school for me. Though my Spanish is still very simple; it is better and more

functional in the community. I will continue to take lessons after school with a private teacher. I am thankful for God's leading, for the school staff and my teacher."

"New staff arrived this past Sunday, July 30th for a week of orientation. Returning staff return to school tomorrow, August 7th for all staff orientation. Students will begin August 15th. I will be teaching 2nd grade again this year."

Do you want to model the teachings of Jesus? Would you consider teaching oral English a couple of weeks in China? Do you want to spread the word to others who may go, if they only knew. Could you do all or some of these? Then read the following and visit www.volunteersforchina.org

David and Ann Wilson, founders of Volunteers for China (VFC) returned from their annual trip to China just a few weeks ago. They write,

"We returned from our annual trip to China just a few weeks ago. God blessed us by making it possible to secure some teaching sites for next year. Now there are at least 3 teaching opportunities arranged for July 2018. God provided these sites, as we had no power to provide the locations. Schools in China are now asking for teams of volunteers to come.

Yet, this is just the beginning! Without volunteers like you, there still cannot be classes filled with Chinese English teachers soaking up the love of Christ shown through your kind and caring teaching. Two types of volunteers are needed immediately: ones to spread the word about oral English teaching opportunities and ones who are willing to serve. Pray about this ministry need. CHINA: GO, SEE, TEACH as you share the love of Jesus by teaching oral English and as you tell others about this ministry. You've thought about it

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before! Now's the time to act in one of these ways!

For those praying about going, no, you don't need to speak Chinese! Lesson plans are available. It may take about 1.5 hours to prepare each lesson. So expect to spend around 25 hours of preparation work. We help you through each step of the way. US Passport required that is valid through January 2019.

Age limitations may apply. Volunteers must be extremely well physically, spiritually, and mentally. Able to bear up to extreme heat and humidity. Being a team player is key. Must be flexible at all times. Do not expect American comforts and conveniences while serving. Immunizations are highly advisable.

Travel dates are flexible as long as you can meet the stated arrival date.

1. July 6 to August 6, Amity Foundation Summer English Program; \$1,700 plus international airline fare. Teaching Chinese English teachers. One week orientation in Nanjing and three weeks teaching, M-F at the assigned site. Arrival and departure Shanghai.

2. July 5 to July 23. 3 teaching programs in the Changzhi, Shanxi, area. \$1,400 plus international airline fare. Teaching Chinese English teachers, university students and some senior high school students. Two weeks teaching M-F in the classroom. Arrival and departure Beijing.

We always encourage people to "Pray, Plan, Act!", sometimes all at once. Please let us know of your interest and we will provide more details. Each Chinese school has officials wanting our American teachers to come and help their teachers improve spoken English skills. The saddest thing we do is to tell a school next April that we have no teachers for them.

For those willing, Volunteers for China depends on volunteers spreading the word, and praying for us and the programs in China. The Wilsons and other volunteers are available to speak at college events and churches to explain teaching programs in China. Please ask us for more information and scheduling dates."

Volunteer Teachers are accepted on an application basis. Individuals who wish to receive a Volunteer visa from Agape Home must commit to a minimum stay of at least 3 months. Others who wish to come may stay in Thailand up to one month on a Tourist Visa which may be obtained at the point of entry.

Volunteers at Agape home are NOT paid an allowance and are NOT provided accommodations or meals.

Volunteers will work directly with children who have HIV/AIDS please educate yourself regarding working with people with HIV/Aids prior to arrival in Chiang Mai. Make yourself aware, however, you should not be fearful as there are no documented cases from causal contact to include biting fighting or contact sports.

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Retired IMB Missionary Invited to Teach In the Philippines

Dr. Les Hill, FBE Interim Director was invited to return to teach at the Southern Philippine Baptist Theological Seminary (SPBTS) the latter part of September 2016,

The seminary is located in Davao City on the southern large island, Mindanao. Hill and his wife Jan had served for 30 years in the Philippines as missionaries with the IMB, SBC. Having retired in 2001, they appreciated the invitation to return. Dr. Edgar Aungon, president of SPBTS invited Hill to lead a study concerning Baptist distinctives.

Between 55 to 60 seminary and Bible school graduates attended the 5 day learning event. Those who elected to fulfill pre and post-conference assignments received special credit. People often ask if a Filipino language is used for such events. Large numbers of different Filipino languages make it impractical to select one. In addition, relationships with the United States have resulted in English serving as the lingua franca among many Filipinos. So using English was necessary.

In addition president Dr. Aungon requested Hill to serve as the SPBTS' 61st Foundation Day Speaker.

The trip gave the Hills opportunity to meet with Filipino leaders who fulfill the leadership roles for various Baptist institutions. As leaders they affirm the long term purpose of mission efforts. The Hills had opportunity to consult with Baptist publisher Church Strengthening Ministries, Inc.

Leaving Davao, the couple made a stop at the Philippine Baptist Theological Seminary in Baguio City on Luzon Island where Hill was asked to speak in chapel.



In addition renewed fellowship with many longtime friends added to the joy of the experience along with the teaching opportunity. Good tropical fruits i.e. mangos, papaya, and of course durian, "king of the fruits" (Tastes like heaven and smells like the opposite!) were greatly appreciated.
